NGI AT A GLANCE

The Next Generation Internet (NGI) is a European Commission initiative that aims to shape the development and evolution of the Internet into an Internet of Trust. An Internet that responds to people's fundamental needs, including **trust, security**, and **inclusion**, while reflecting the values and the norms all citizens enjoy in Europe.

SUPPORTING INTERNET INNOVATION - AN ECOSYSTEM APPROACH

The NGI is providing funding to support innovators including individual researchers, developers, start-ups and SMEs and an ecosystem for efforts to flourish and grow contributing to Europe technological sovereignty

- **NGI Research and Innovation Actions** are acting as intermediaries: 20% of their budget is dedicated to select, monitor, mentor, train and build the community; 80% to fund individual projects among 3rd party individuals and/or organisations
- **NGI Coordination and Support Actions** are at work to ensure synergies across all stakeholders, with a focus on:
 - Outreach, community building, business acceleration
 - Policy and strategic programming
 - EU-US/CANADA collaboration

OPEN SOURCE AND INTERNET COMMONS FOR EUROPE'S DIGITAL SOVEREIGNTY

- **The NGI Commons project** main ambition is to help relevant NGI efforts to integrate and align with national and European digital commons policies.
- The project seeks to elaborate on a long-term strategy for Internet Commons, which are critical for sovereignty and trust, helping to overcome fragmentation and close the gap between grassroots commoners' initiatives and top-down sovereignty policies.

THE NGI COMMONS AMBITION

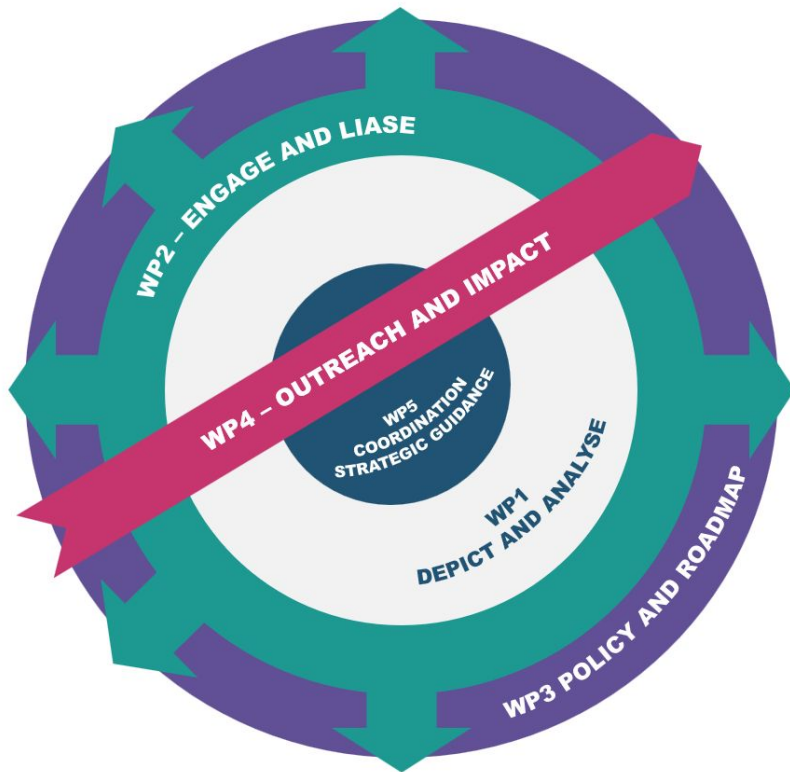
A 36 months CSA started in January 2024



Digital Commons (DC) have become increasingly relevant and diverse, and have crossed paths with core digital governance issues such as digital sovereignty and self-determination over personal data.

NGI Commons aims to ensure strategic alignment and integration of the NGI efforts within the broader European DC context, elaborating on a long-term strategy for DC, helping to overcome fragmentation and close the gap between grass-root commoners initiatives and top-down sovereignty policies

NGI COMMONS WORK ORGANISATION



- **WP1:** to map relevant European commoners initiatives, assess their maturity, and examine the main challenges and priorities for their evolution, while analysing the leverage effect (actual and potential) of NGI funding.
- **WP2:** to engage DC/IC experts in analysing the NGI portfolio, foster collaborations with relevant emerging initiatives at national/local, European and international levels and develop a plan to support further development of commoners initiatives
- **WP3:** to develop a strategic agenda for including DC/IC policies valid for the EU MFF timeframe, and define a long-term strategy that enables the NGI to become a pillar of EU investment into public digital infrastructures that are based on democratic values and contribute to digital sovereignty and trust.
- **WP4:** To increase awareness and promote DC/IC and OS initiatives, as well as relevant digital sovereignty policies and NGI efforts for broad, sustainable and impactful exploitation of assets.

Digital Commons Task Force

The NGI Commons DCTF is an expert body – helping NGI Commons to shape its research and policy outputs by analysing the NGI portfolio and the effect of NGI funding on Digital Commons/Internet Commons (DC/IC).
